

- One way to achieve the much-needed comprehensive Covid-19 pandemic solutions is through the Health in All Policies (HiAP) approach.
- HiAP is a transformative, collaborative approach that incorporates health considerations into policy-making across sectors to improve the health and well-being of all communities and people (CDC, USA).
- At its core, HiAP is about practicing a whole-of-government approach to solving major challenges that are too big and complicated that no one single government agency can manage them on their own.

Sarawak Disaster Management Committee (SDMC) - A HiAP-Style Interagency Committee

The 9th Global Conference of the Alliance for Healthy Cities

- SDMC was established by the Sarawak Government to coordinate preparedness and response to major events including natural disasters (floods, transboundary haze) and infectious disease epidemic/pandemic.
- Recognising and acknowledging that Covid-19 was a potential major event in Sarawak, SDMC <u>quickly activated</u> its operation to coordinate the pandemic preparedness and responses in February 2020.
- <u>All</u> relevant government agencies (Federal and State agencies)/private sector/institutions of higher learning/experts/significant individuals were quickly identified to establish the committee.

MEDIA STATEMENT FOR IMMEDIATE USE

This is the ${\bf latest}$ Sarawak Government's Policy Direction in regard to the global COVID-19 outbreak.

Since the COVID-19 outbreak, there is no known COVID-19 infection in Sarawak. To ensure Sarawak remains free of the sickness, the following immigration policies are being enforced.

- Our immigration policies for those visitors, Malaysians (non-resident of Sarawak) and Sarawakians who have been to China in the past 14 days are remain the same.
- All Foreigners (irrespective of nationalities) who have been to South Korea in the past 14 days will be REFUSED entry into the state.
- 3. All Malaysians (non-resident of Sarawak) who have been to South Korea and China (including Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan) in the last 14 days are strongly advised NOT to visit Sarawak until their 14 days home quarantine have been fully completed and they are not found to have been infected with the COVID-19. As COVID-19 situation is changing, apart from South Korea adding to the list above. SDMC will continue to monitor stuation in other countries like Singapore, Japan, Irane, IJah, Itak.
- 4. All Sarawakians and Sarawakian PR, Work and Student Visa holders who have been to South Korea and China (including Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan) in the last 14 days must have COMPULSORY home quarantine for 14 days. They will be subjected to random monitoring by the relevant authorities.
- All visitors from Covid-19 affected countries such as Singapore, Italy, Iran, Japanase are strongly advised to adhere to precautionary guidelines issued by the Sarawak Health Department.

The above actions are taken as part of the Sarawak State Government's efforts and measures to mitigate the spread of the COVID-19 into Sarawak.




Establishing Low Risk Quarantine Centres (PKRCs)




