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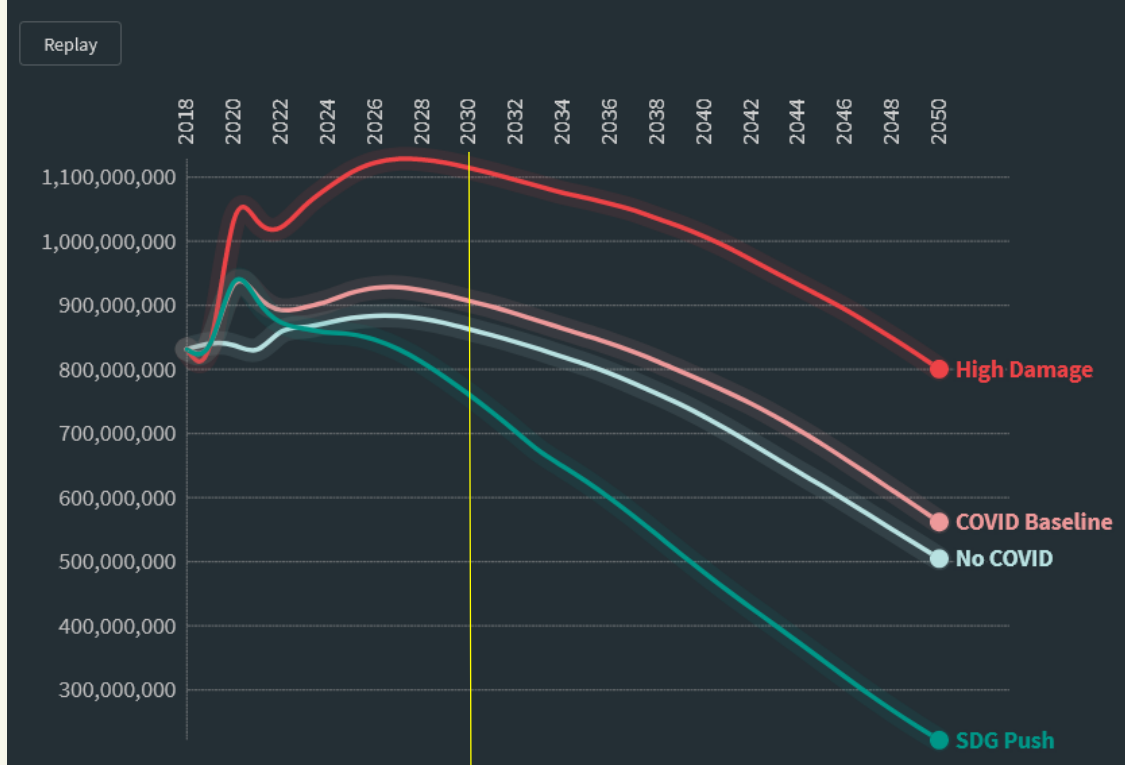

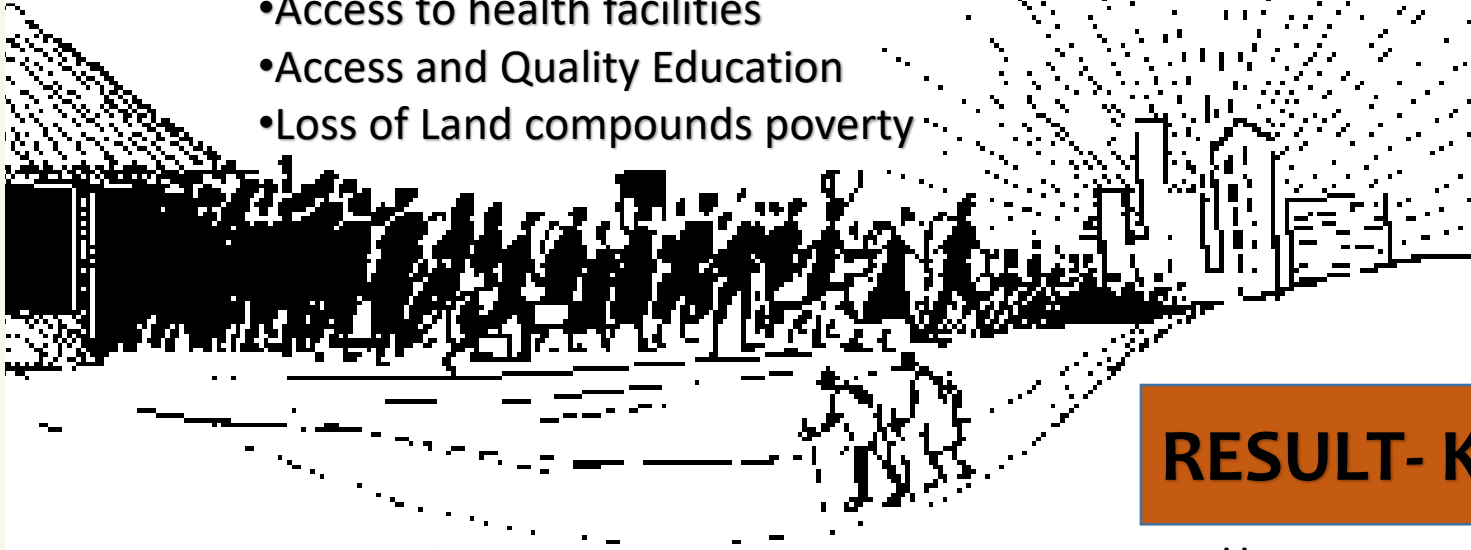
The Covid-10 pandemic has created a new reality to manage and improve.

- pressures on the health delivery system;
- closure of businesses with resulting income loss for many;
- isolation experienced as people physically distanced; and
- impact on education.

RURAL - URBAN MIGRATION

- Job opportunities
- Access to health facilities
- Access and Quality Education
- Loss of Land compounds poverty



RESULT- KAMPONG CHAWAN

- Homes are cramped, unsafe and dilapidated
- Low income
- No electricity connection
- Limited clean water source
- Male adults mainly worked as drivers, labourers & contract workers at nearby factories & plants
- female as cooks, cleaners & sales assistants
- Jobless during the pandemic
- Most rely on donors for food
- Schooling for children interrupted : many without proper gadgets for online classes

Aims of the Project:

1. to address the inequitable effects the Covid-19 pandemic on the community at Kampong Chawan.
 2. to empower and mobilise the residents' group to take charge of their affairs through a participatory process of
 - community engagement,
 - consultation,
 - decision making and
 - collective action.
- The entire process identified community owned solutions through a needs assessment conducted by the **community champions**.
 - This ensured effective solutions are put in place before resident groups executed their work plans
 - The multi-stakeholder approach saw several engagements with government agencies during the process.

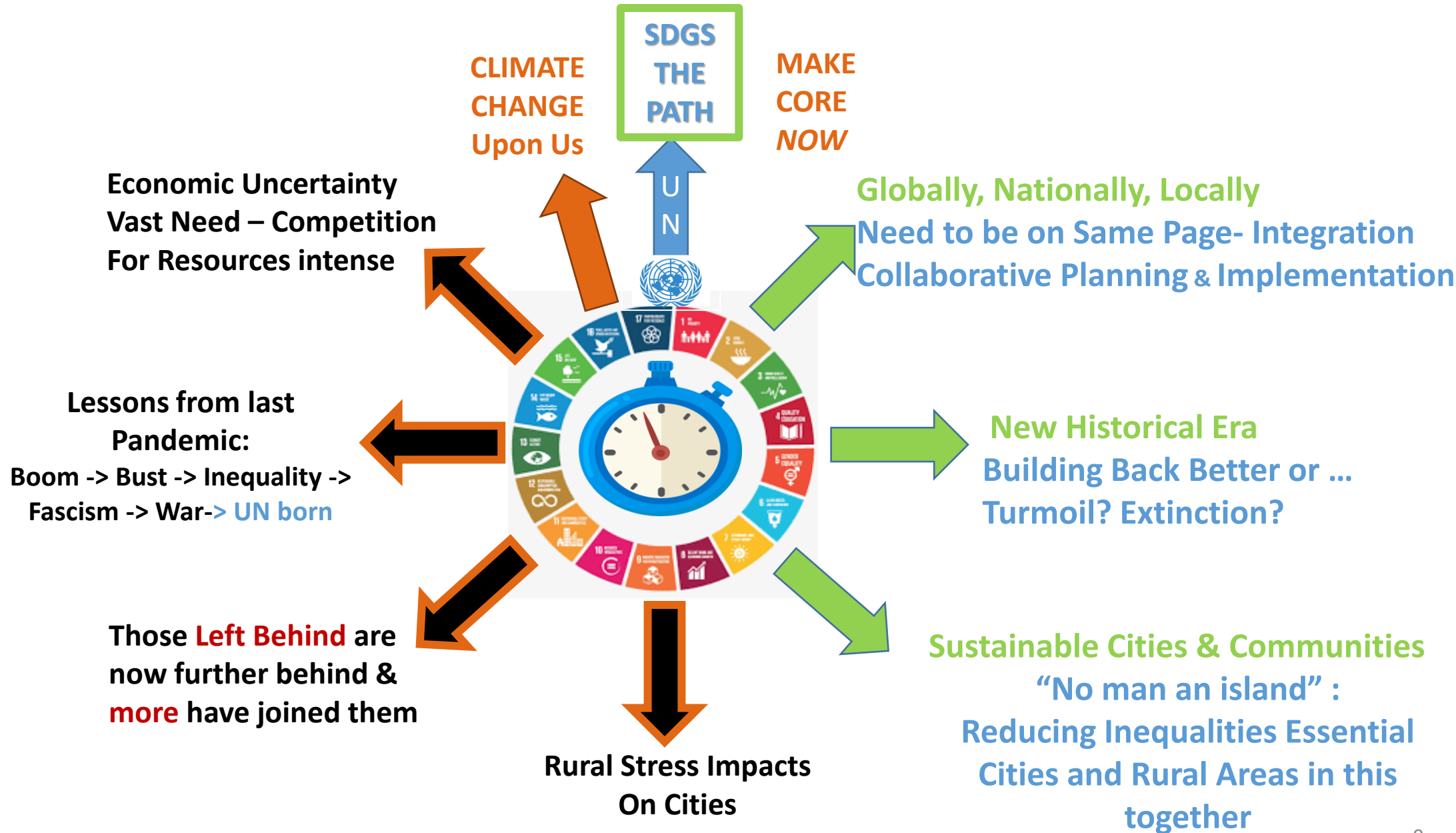

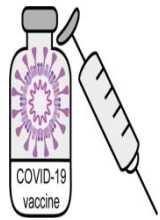
